


## Project History

After the successful installation of 5 murals at the Donald McKay School in 2021, **we heard a resounding outcry from the East Boston public school community for more large-scale, inspiring artworks to beautify educational spaces and uplift students.** This presented an exciting opportunity for collaboration with Eastie Farm.

Through the Harvest project, students who are engaged in Eastie Farm's programs are empowered to share their knowledge through the universal language of ARTivism. Together with professional artists, the students illustrate and express their understanding of the critical role the natural world plays in our health.

**The students' ideas are inspired in a new series of murals at their schools, inspiring future generations to take action and care for our planet and all of its inhabitants.**








# 2022 Project Budget Report

## For Harvest 2022, we raised \$100,000.

The funding produced 3 semi-permanent monumental public installations at 2 schools, and 6 weeks of educational programming with the students engaged in the project.

Our 5% contingency budget still remains, and will be allocated towards the continuation of this project.
